Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) revalidating certain enrolled provider organizations

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) instructed DHS to revalidate all provider organizations delivering certain high-risk services by May 31, 2026. DHS is conducting an off-cycle revalidation of all enrolled Medical Assistance (Medicaid) provider organizations that provide those services. This effort is known as [Minnesota Revalidate 2026](#).

Providers who see UCare Medical Assistance members in UCare Connect, MinnesotaCare, Minnesota Senior Care Plus or Prepaid Medical Assistance Program plans for the following services are required to revalidate:

- Adult Companion Services
- Adult Day Services
- Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services (ARMHS)
- Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)
- Community First Services and Supports (CFSS)
- Early Intensive Developmental and Behavioral Intervention (EIDBI)
- Integrated Community Supports (ICS)
- Intensive Residential Treatment Services (IRTS)
- Nonemergency Medical Transportation Services (NEMT)
- Peer Recovery Services
- Recuperative Care

DHS will send disenrollment notifications to non-responsive providers. Providers have 60 days from the date of the disenrollment notification to appeal. If a provider does not complete or pass the revalidation process, it may lead to service disruptions for members.

To support continuity of care, DHS will share a list of **residential service providers** expected to be disenrolled with UCare. UCare will contact these providers to confirm that an appropriate plan is in place to assist members currently receiving services to minimize any service disruptions.
