

# -55 Post-Operative Management Only Modifier

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Surgical services include pre-operative, intraoperative and postoperative care. When a physician or other qualified health care professional appends the -55 modifier to a surgical procedure, it indicates that only the post-operative services associated with the global surgical package were performed by the physician or other qualified health care professional.

When different providers in a group practice participate in the care of the patient, the global surgical package should be billed. The physician who performs the surgery should be listed as the performing physician.

The information outlined below applies to all UCare products. Product specific payment information is outlined below.

## **Payment Information**

UCare Medicare Advantage, Dually Integrated Programs when Medicare is the Primary Payer and UCare Commercial Products

- All UCare Medicare and Commercial products follow Medicare guidelines.
- Payment for eligible services will be based on the post-operative percentage as defined by Medicare. Detailed information is available in the Medicare Claims Manual (See link below).

### MHCP (When MHCP is the primary payer for the service)

Payment for eligible professional services is 20% of the UCare base allowed amount.

### **Appropriate Use**

- The provider performs only the post-operative care, and the surgical procedure and preoperative care was furnished by a provider from another group practice.
- The -55 modifier should be appended to surgical procedure codes only.
- The surgery performed has a 90 or 10 day global period.

## **Inappropriate Use**

- The -55 modifier is appended to any service other than a surgical procedure with a global period of 90 or 10 days.
- Care during the global period was furnished by multiple providers in the same group practice.
